Delay and closure messages will NOT be put on the district's Snow Hotline in English or Spanish this year. Besides the website, follow the district on Twitter.

In the event that the weather does not improve, a decision may be made to go from a delay to a closure, so it is important for students, parents, and staff to continue monitoring. Every effort will be made to have a final decision by 6:45 a.m.

A two-hour delay means no breakfast, no a.m. kindergarten, no morning Kee-waydin or ECEAP classes, and no morning Tri-Tech classes.
