Facilities/Special Programs

Kennewick High School is a AAAA school with approximately 1530 students in grades 9-12. The school has been academically accredited for over 75 years by the Northwest Accreditation Association of Schools. The high school was established in 1890 in downtown Kennewick and has been at its present location since 1950. Last year we celebrated the 100th commencement of KHS. The first graduation occurred in 1908.

A \$12 million renovation was completed in 1990 and the school now has 202,000 square feet with 6 portables, 2 major playing fields, auditorium and stadium. A new gymnasium which holds 2000 spectators was built in 2004 costing \$3.5 million..

Many unique offerings make Kennewick High School a magnet school. Some of these offerings include the International Baccalaureate Program; technical assistance programs in Computer Science and Theatre; English as a Second Language (ESL); Life Skills for the developmentally impaired youth; Careers in Education; Material Science, CAD, Principals of Technology, and American Sign Language.

Financial Resources

In the 2008-2009 school-year the district budget for Kennewick High School was just over \$540,000. This money comes from the state apportionment, special state funding, local levy dollars, Gates Foundation Grant funding, and levy equalization funds.

Parents and Community,

The staff and administration at Kennewick High are focusing on literacy for the future. Our students must be able to read and write to be successful. Our entire staff has incorporated reading into each curricular area. Every teacher must be a teacher of reading. Our focus is to increase student achievement and to close the gap between high and low achieving students. Our teachers are focusing on the type of work that they give our students on a daily basis, ensuring that the work is relevant, creates authentic learning and promotes profound learning opportunities.

We believe that students need a connection and a person to whom they feel they can trust and go to in times of need. Only freshmen attended the first day of school. We have a day-long orientation and transition for incoming freshmen while the upper classmen meet with counselors, pick up schedules and help with the orientation of the freshmen. We found that discipline and attendance problems were drastically reduced for last year's freshmen as well as an improving over-all GPA.
